


Walk for April

Terrington, Broats Lane, Thurtle Wood, Hall Moor, Fryton Moor

A walk through a variety of landscapes including some excellent woodland. Any noise you encounter on the sections of road walking are amply compensated by the almost total silence and peace of the Hall Moor and Fryton Moor areas.

Terrington lies some 3 miles west of Castle Howard and is signposted from the crossroads near the Great Lake. Church Lane runs off the main street through the village opposite an old white painted water pump. There is ample parking on the right.

Start — The centre of Terrington Village
Distance – 6½ miles **Duration** – 3 to 3½ hours



1. From the car rejoin the main street, turn left and go out of the village. Care is needed as the road bends several times before passing a T junction with a road off left to Castle Howard.
2. Just 10 yards after the junction go left up the track waymarked 'Ganthorpe'. At the top of the rise the track is tree lined, weaving through undergrowth before emerging

into a field where the path runs along the topside of the field with the hedge on your right. At the end of the field go straight ahead, now with a wood on your right, through another gate before reaching the end of the wood with a gate straight in front.

3. Go through the gate and head in the direction of the waymark, approximately 1 o'clock, crossing the field diagonally to another gate. Go through that gate and again at 1 o'clock, cross towards the gate visible in the wall beyond. Go through that gate and pass along the wide path through the wood, There is quite a steep climb before reaching, at the top, a gate into a field
4. Cross the field at 11 o'clock towards a point just left of the visible stretch of wall and exit the field across a wooden footbridge. 20 yards on you meet the road. Turn left and walk uphill alongside the road for about half a mile.
5. At the brow of the hill, as the road bends left and goes downhill, take the waymarked stoned road that goes off to the right at 1 o'clock signed ' Terrington, Slingsby,etc'. About 600 yards along turn right at the waymark signed 'Slingsby' and pass into the wood. Stay on the main track through the wood keeping in the same general northerly direction and mainly downhill. The track exits the wood overlooking the valley of Hall Moor. Continue downhill towards the other wood beyond.
6. Just before entering the wood, turn left along the grey sandy track with the wood on the right. The track bends slightly away from the wood then resumes the same direction across open fields before meeting a track. Turn left along the track then 200 yards further on, before reaching the farm, turn right along the track that climbs then descends quite steeply round a bend to pass between two ponds. Go straight ahead towards the farm buildings beyond.
7. Pass into the farmyard area then just before reaching the main farmhouse exit the yard left past the Centenary Way signpost to join the stoned lane leading uphill. Take the right hand lane as it forks near the summit then go downhill. 200 yards along , as the lane levels out, go right at the waymark towards Terrington, passing a small lake on the left. Continue climbing to the end of the field then turn right as waymarked, round the edge of the field then sharp left at the end of the high wall to arrive on the school playing field. Skirt round the wall and at its end pass out of the field through a gate to arrive at the road by the church, and back to your vehicle.
