As you know **The Friends of Malton Museum** support the museum, not just financially, but in a variety of ways. It has been a busy summer and these are just some of the projects where Friends supported museum projects.

Publicity Day - when Friends supported an initiative to publicise the 2019 exhibition “Malton Horse Power”. Malcolm Barnard and his Farrier friend Jarvis Browning gave a demonstration of horse shoe making “in the field “. Dressed in authentic uniforms, and using contemporary tools, they produced horse shoes on a genuine Great War field forge. The public were treated to a depiction of army farriers setting up a forge near the battlefield, and quickly making the horse shoes necessary to keep the Army “on the move”.



The Front of House Team, - meeting and greeting almost 2000 visitors so far this year. Each shift is three hours long from 10 to 1pm and from 1 - 4pm. Training is provided

The Pop Up Shop - in April - masterminded by Isabel Jones was a huge success making a profit of £2,565 for museum funds was supported by a network of Friends and Volunteers

Town Tours of Malton take place every month - the tours tell the interesting history of the Market Place and introduce some well-known characters from bygone days. A set route has been established and two volunteer guides help to deliver the tour. The tours take place once a month, usually on a Saturday from 11am-12:30. The tour team always welcome additional tour guides and if you would like to become a guide and, as part of the Tour Guide team, you will help to deliver Malton Museum’s Town Tours. Training is provided, including the opportunity to shadow a town tour before delivering your first one.

The Summer Lectures - the series of 4 successful lectures achieved good audiences on each occasion. All the concerts are supported by a team of Friends - just 3 of the team who provide support

The Learning Team - Speaking to both children’s and adult groups meet on an ad hoc basis and plan and deliver a range of learning activities. This includes family workshops in the school holidays, outreach sessions at libraries and other heritage sites. The team have completed over 20 sessions this year. Projects have ranged from gathering photographs to create a racing flipbook, creating horse memory boxes, capturing oral histories and carrying out new research with volunteers.
